EcoMove™ Reusable Transfer Sheet

This guide covers all products with the prefix RTSH in the product code.

The **EcoMove™ Reusable Transfer Sheet** enables users to transfer their patients from one lying surface to another across a lateral transfer board. Available in four sizes, with or without handles.



USER INSTRUCTIONS



- 1 Fold the **EcoMove™ Reusable Transfer Sheet** in half and insert under the log rolled patient.

Pull the sheet out so it lies flat and covers half the lying surface.

- Log roll patient in other direction and pull out the rest of the sheet so it is flat.

The patient should now be lying fully on the sheet and all handles should be accessible.

- Bring the two surfaces together. Then staff on the furthest side of the patient can now use the handles of the sheet to log roll the patient towards them to allow the lateral transfer board (lying on the receiving surface) to be inserted easily.

Lower the patient gently, slide the feet onto the board and, using co-ordinated commands, slide the patient gently from the giving surface to the receiving surface. It can help if the giving surface is slightly higher than the receiving surface.

Once the patient is safely on the receiving surface, remove the board by log rolling the patient.



Reposition patient.

The patient can remain on the sheet until it is no longer needed.

Remove the sheet after use.



MATERIAL CONTENT

Fabric: 100% polyester with 50% recycled content

Handles: Woven cotton



STORAGE AND HANDLING

- Store in a clean dry environment that is not subject to excessive heat.
- Keep away from sunlight.
- Store flat and avoid placing heavy objects on top of the product.

WARNINGS AND PRECAUTIONS

- Do not leave the on the floor when not being used.
- Inspect the product, including handles, before use for signs of damage or tears.
- Safe Working Load (SWL): 500 kg

CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS

- Wash as per laundry instructions.
- Can be wiped clean, between use with the same patient, with natural water and detergent or wipes that don't contain alcohol, solvents, bleaching or abrasive agents.
- Cleaning materials used should be patient safe and biodegradable..

DISPOSAL INSTRUCTIONS

- Recyclable-suitable for mechanical or chemical polyester recycling. Where possible, repair and reuse.
- Recycle through your nearest recycling point; fabric is not designed for kerbside collection.
- If the fabric is used in circumstances where they have come into contact with an infectious person or environment, dispose of it as clinical waste.
